OFFICE & ADMINISTRATOR

AAMS has secured office space at civic 795 Highway 1, Comeauville, N.S. The building is owned by the Municipality of Clare and currently houses the studios of radio station CIFA. Substantial renovations will take place this spring that will result in low rental office spaces for culturally based non-profit organizations creating a "Cultural Hub" at this location. Tenders for the renovations are now being sought and it is anticipated that AAMS will be able to occupy the office in June or July of 2017.

Alice Comeau has been hired full-time as Office Administrator for AAMS. A grant called "START PROGRAM" has been awarded to AAMS. The "START" grant pays seventy-five percent of the Office Administrator's salary for the first six months of full-time employment. Alice comes to AAMS with years of organizational and administrative assistant experience and has already started working from her home while waiting for the AAMS Office to be ready for occupancy. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For reasons of brevity and with a promise of more newsletters to come in 2017, I will keep this report short and only as it pertains to a symposium that took place in Ottawa on March 21st and 22nd, 2017. Called the "Daniels Symposium" it was facilitated by the Congress of Aboriginal People and attended by Alyre Theriault (2nd Vice) and myself (Joseph Jacquard-President). Federal Minister of Indigenous Affairs, Carolyn Bennett made a brief speech promising to put into serious consideration the report generated by the symposium. The Federal government is working towards a comprehensive plan for all indigenous people in Canada and asked for continued patience because "these things take time to get it right" and she is not quite ready to divulge details.

The overall message of the symposium was positive for Acadian-Métis. Many speakers spoke of "let us be all inclusive from Coast to Coast and leave no Métis behind". Another strong and recurring theme was "stop the infighting".

Often the real negotiations take place in the halls and behind closed doors. This symposium was no exception. Alyre and myself had breakfast twice with the President of the Métis Federation of Canada, the Vice President of The Congress of Aboriginal Peoples, and continued networking with people from across Canada. Our struggles with governments are not unique only to the Maritimes.

The most surprising event in Ottawa was an impromptu meeting with Jason Deveau and Colin Fraser (Member of Parliament Southwest Nova). The one hour meeting left us pleasantly surprised about of their knowledge of AAMS, Métis affairs, and their offer of assistance and support.
